The *Doctor of Theology and Ministry (DThM)* degree is an academic and professional Doctorate requiring original research and practical application to ministry and service. An alternative to the Ph.D., the DThM is directed and examined in the same way as a Ph.D. course of study but without the language requirement. There are five courses and a dissertation with oral defense totaling 36 credit-hours of systematic study. www.northwindseminary.org/degrees

The degree concentration in Romantic Theology is designed as two-year Doctorate for those with an earned Master's degree in a related field. The course of study offers teachers, writers, and life-long learners a formative way to read or review the creative works of the Oxford Inklings, do original research in the field of Inklings Studies, and contribute to the future of Romantic Theology as a subclass of theological studies.

Doctoral Program Description

The *Doctor of Theology and Ministry (DThM)* at Northwind Seminary is a certified degree of advanced study, designed and delivered in an accelerated online format. A total of 36 credit hours are required, including a doctoral dissertation and defense. Cost of tuition for 2024 is a competitive \$600 per credit hour. With a previous Master's Degree in a related field, students can complete the requirements in *as little as two years*. www.northwindseminary.org/degrees

Northwind's course of study in Romantic Theology features five "Oxford-style" online tutorials with a faculty mentor for whom you will write five topic essays per course for evaluation. Video-lectures, vetted digital resources, and course materials are accessed through the classroom portal on the Northwind Seminary website. Group Discussions via *Zoom* for student presentations, faculty engagement, and conversations with authors and guest lecturers are scheduled periodically.

Dr. Michael Christensen as Center Director directs the program. Featured Faculty and Distinguished Lecturers (noted Inklings scholars) serve as faculty mentors, expert resources, and doctoral committee members.
